



\$62 Million in Weatherization Funds to Expire Soon

Call CHPC Now if You Own Federally Assisted Low Income Rental Properties in Los Angeles, Orange, San Bernardino, Riverside, and Santa Clara Counties

Time Is Running Out To Access Federal Weatherization Funding

As of August 31st, 2011, \$62 million remained out of \$185 million in funding allocated to California for the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP). Multifamily property owners must act now to access these funds, which were provided by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) and will return to the treasury if unspent when the ARRA contract expires on March 31, 2012.

Find Out Today if Your Building Is Qualified To Receive Funding

Federally assisted properties in Los Angeles, Orange, San Bernardino, Riverside, and Santa Clara counties may qualify to receive weatherization services. CHPC can assist you in determining whether or not your buildings qualify and can provide you with information on how to access the program.

Up To \$6,500 Per Unit in Free WAP Services

The U.S. Department of Energy's Weatherization Assistance Program provides funding for free weatherization and energy efficiency upgrades to eligible low-income renters and owners. Weatherization measures install the most advanced technologies, leading to more energy savings, which helps maintain affordable housing and allows benefits to be passed on to tenants.

Weatherization Measures:

Under WAP, up to \$6,500 of weatherization services, per qualified unit, can include measures such as:

- High efficiency domestic water heater boilers
- Lighting retrofits and lighting controls
- Low flow aerators and low flow showerheads
- Pipe insulation and water heater blankets
- Domestic Hot Water (DHW) recirculation controls
- Air sealing
- Insulation
- Programmable thermostats
- High efficiency motor retrofit
